**Website Traffic**

During fiscal year 2009-2010, 52 pages of the Library's web site were viewed a total of 193,863 times. This is an increase of 23% over 157,029 page views of last fiscal year. This was the 5<sup>th</sup> highest subsection viewed on the University's web site. The most popular Library pages visited were the Databases page, the Library Guides page, the general page with the library's hours, and the library services page.

**Library Workshops**

The librarians offered a series of 24 workshops on Researching Basics, Writing the Research Paper: Tips and Tricks, the University Archives, newly acquired databases, such as *America's News*, and conducting effective research in a variety of subject areas, such as criminal justice, business and company research, general science, literature, global issues, and legal basics. These workshops are open to everyone in the UNH Community. In addition, faculty and students can schedule their own Library Instruction session for their class or for individual sessions. The Library also conducts specialized workshops to support faculty development in areas such as grants, the IRIS database for identifying grant opportunities, and new database opportunities. **Common Read 2010**

For the fourth year the University Library has partnered with Students Services and Academic Services to provide the Common Read as part of the University's Freshman Experience Program. In addition to serving on the Common Read Selection Committee, the Library prepares a webpage with additional information about the selected book, its author, major themes, and how to obtain assistance from Library Staff. It has proven to be very popular with our students. ## **Highlights on**

### **Library Assessment**

In order to ensure continuous quality improvement of library services to graduate and undergraduate students as well as faculty, the library conducted surveys and a focus group with the help of graduate students, Nicholas Wedge and Brian Ralph. The results are analyzed for opportunities to enhance our services and make well-informed decisions.

In the Fall of 2009 a Student Focus Group was conducted by Nicholas Wedge. The focus group was facilitated as a follow-up to the UNH Library Student Satisfaction Survey held last year and to delve into more qualitative data concerning student's opinions, feelings, and ideas about the Marvin K. Peterson Library. Results of the focus group were recorded and kept anonymous. Overall, the responses show that students tend to be satisfied with the Marvin K. Peterson Library. They have minor frustrations concerning the physical layout of the facility and some frustration with the library hours. However, the group also demonstrated that students are pleased with the new printing system and enjoy aspects such as Jazzman's Café, and the different dynamics of each floor of the library.

"Focus Group Follow-up Survey" survey was conducted in the Winter of 2010. The data collected in the fall 2009 focus group was used to design an online follow-up survey for the student body at the University of New Haven to uncover in more detail what students are satisfied with at the library, in addition to what they would like changed. Almost half of the student users of the library both use their own personal laptops and want to see change in areas such as electrical outlet availability, most students would like to see different library hours for Friday and Saturday, and the UNH Library student population appears to be generally satisfied with the physical environment of the facility in terms of quietness of the specific floors and study rooms.

In the Spring of 2010 Brian Ralph conducted the "Marvin K. Peterson Library Resource Development Initiative: Needs Assessment Evaluation" of faculty. The focus of the evaluation was to assess the current resources offered by the Marvin K. Peterson Library, as well as the desirability of projected resource innovations. The focus was approached with the following goals in mind: to assess faculty perceptions of the quality of students' work, to assess the adequacy of resources currently offered by the library and its staff, and to assess the desirability of resource innovations currently under consideration at the library.

### **Library Instruction Program**

The Librarians in the library instruction program provided a total of 95 different bibliographic sessions and workshops reaching 1,710 students, not including the customized day-to-day library orientations for individual faculty and students. All freshman English (E105) classes receive a Library Instruction session sometime during the semester. E105 is part of the University's core curriculum and almost every student at the University must take this course. This face-to-face classroom session is taught by the librarians. It serves as an introduction to the Library and effective research techniques. Information Literacy Reports were prepared for the Fall 2009 semester. ### Center for Learning Resources locating to the Library

Discussions regarding utilizing Library space for more focused student development and retention efforts have resulted in the location of the Center for Learning Resources in the Library. This should be very advantageous to our students. It will also provide Library staff with the opportunity to collaborate and work more closely with the staff of the Center for Learning Resources in expanding student services and enriching students' academic life.

The Center for Learning Resources will be located in space on the Lower Level of the Library.

### Weeding Projects begun for Print Journal and U.S. Government Documents Collections

The Library is consolidating the print journal collection to free up space on the Lower Level. Since most of our journals are now available as e-journals, we do not anticipate needing expansion space for the print collection. The Library currently receives no more than 275 print journal titles, and expects that number will grow even smaller in the years to come. In addition, the Library will be extensively weeding the print and microform U.S. Government Documents collection. Library staff will work very closely with staff in the Government Documents Office at the Connecticut State Library.

### LibGuides

In April 2010 the Library purchased LibGuides, which is an easy to use, Web 2.0 publishing platform designed for libraries. The interface allows librarians to create attractive multimedia guides, promote library resources, and share knowledge and information with other libraries. The goal is to post all of our 60 plus library guides to the LibGuides platform by the beginning of the new academic year. Over the years the librarians have created subject guides to support a wide range of studies at the University including Criminal Justice, Forensic Science, Sports Management, Chemistry, Education, Marketing, and Global Studies to name a few. All of the research guides will also be converted to the LibGuides format. The Library's web page for the Common Read 2010 – *Outcasts United* will also appear on LibGuides. The guide provides information about the book, the author, events on campus regarding the book, how students can get involved in helping their community, and topical resources around the major themes of the book. The Librarians will work closely with Faculty to make good use of resources by developing course specific guides which can be easily used by students. ### **Short Story Club**

To further the Library's vision to build a rich academic social community to support our students and faculty, the Library sponsored a Short Story Club in collaboration with the English Department. Copies of the short story were placed on Course Reserve. Students were encouraged to bring their suggestions for short stories to read over the semester to each meeting. Club meetings were held in the Library. Professor Jeff Foster, English Department, and Hanko Dobi, Library, facilitated the discussions and arranged for light refreshments.

Thanks to the efforts of our Technical Service staff and student assistants, we have begun to digitize and upload historical photos from the University Archives, which are housed in the Peterson Library. This photographic digitization project is being done in-house. These shots include our presidents, buildings, engineering labs in session, graduating classes, aerial views of campus, interiors of the student center pool room, the cafeteria, and much more. ### **Wellington Wang Collection at the Library**

Wellington Tu Wang, one of the world's foremost collectors of Chinese artifacts, has donated "The Art of Rocks from Asia" the Wellington Wang Collection to the University of New Haven. The collection includes Chinese treasures that were scattered throughout Europe and the United States after China's Cultural Revolution.

Part of this collection is permanently installed in the display cases on the Library's main level. His acquisitions over the years have included custom-made knives, historical bronzes, high-quality jades, and Yixing pottery. Wang received an honorary Doctor of Humane Letters degree on May 23, 2009 at the UNH Spring Commencement ceremonies.

Wang was born and raised in Hong Kong. Even as a child, he was a passionate collector of Asian artifacts. While pursuing business in the United States, Wang continued collecting. His accrual of custom-made knives, historical bronzes, and high-quality jades, Yixing pottery, and Asian rocks led to his renown in the field; he is deeply respected in art collecting circles in Asia and has been widely published. His collection of over 15,000 Asian artifacts includes custom-made knives, historical bronzes, Yixing pottery and Asian rocks.

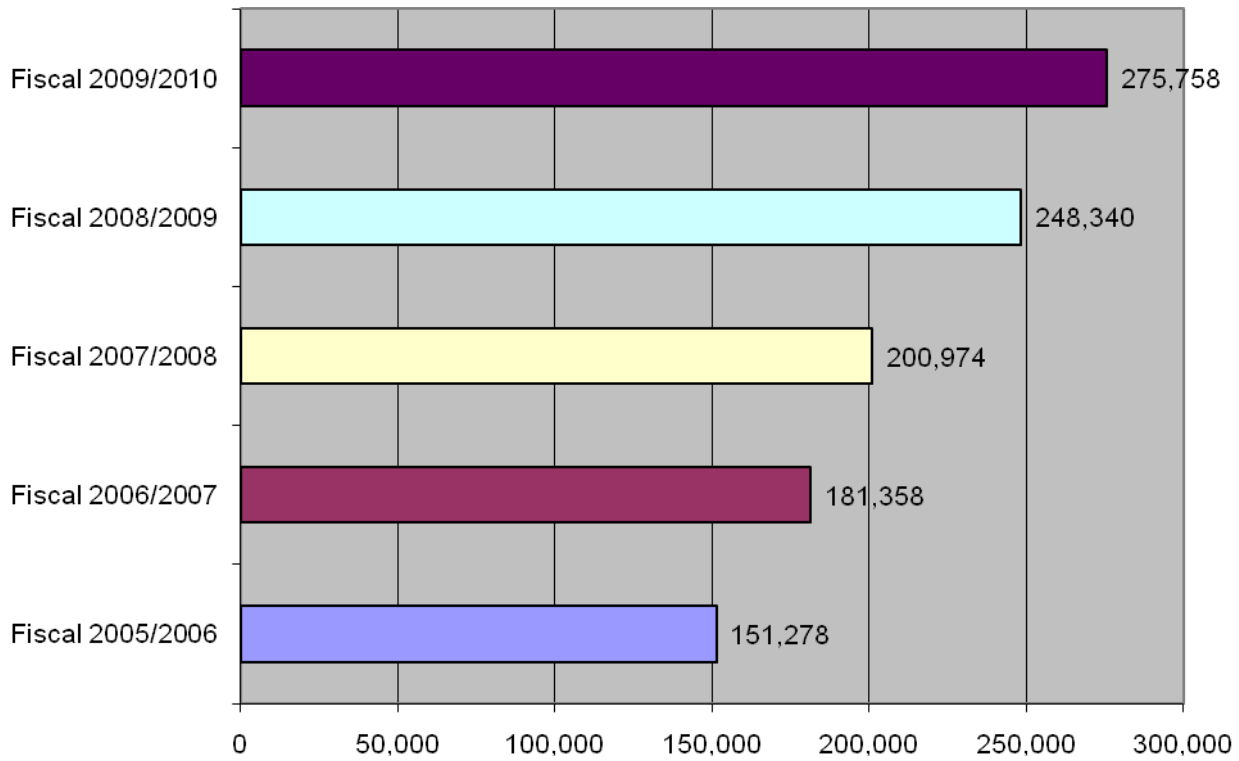
**Growth in the Use of the Physical Facility**

The Library saw a significant 82% increase in the number of people using the facility and 124,480 more visits than 2005/06. The renovations done in the summer of 2006 are a large factor in this increase in usage of the Library's physical facility. There was an 11% increase over last fiscal year. This impacted the staff at the circulation desk as they checked out books, laptops, course reserves and provided service to the networked printers and photocopy machines, as well as answered general questions.

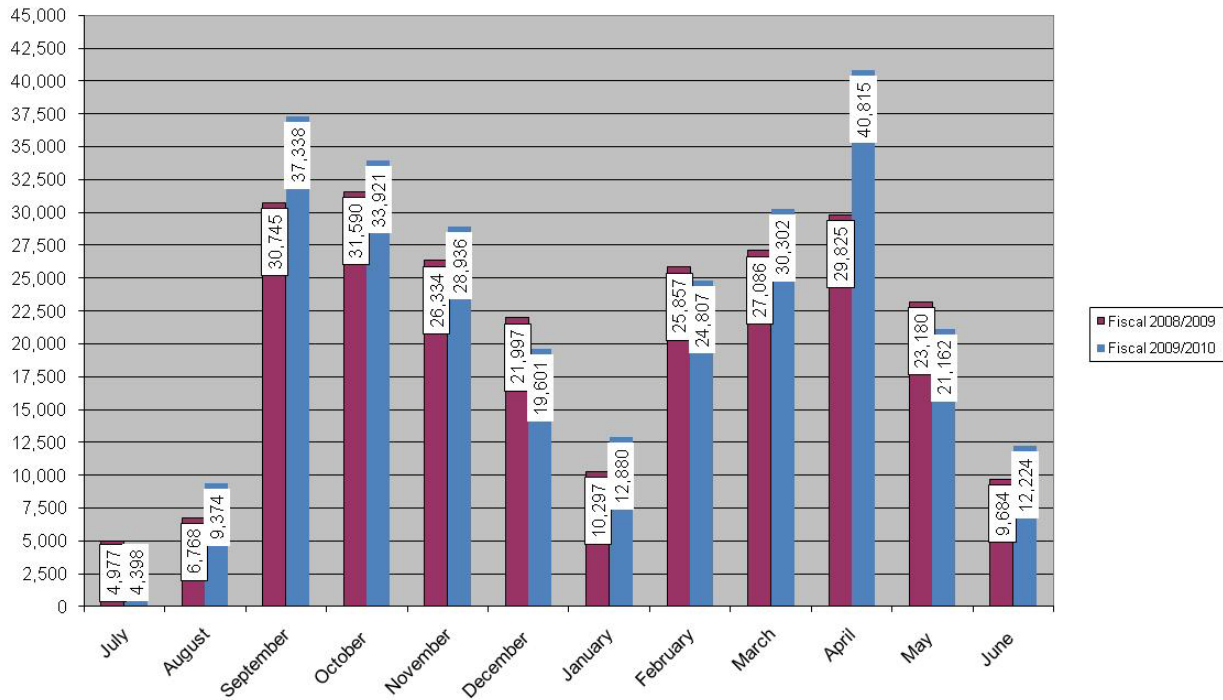

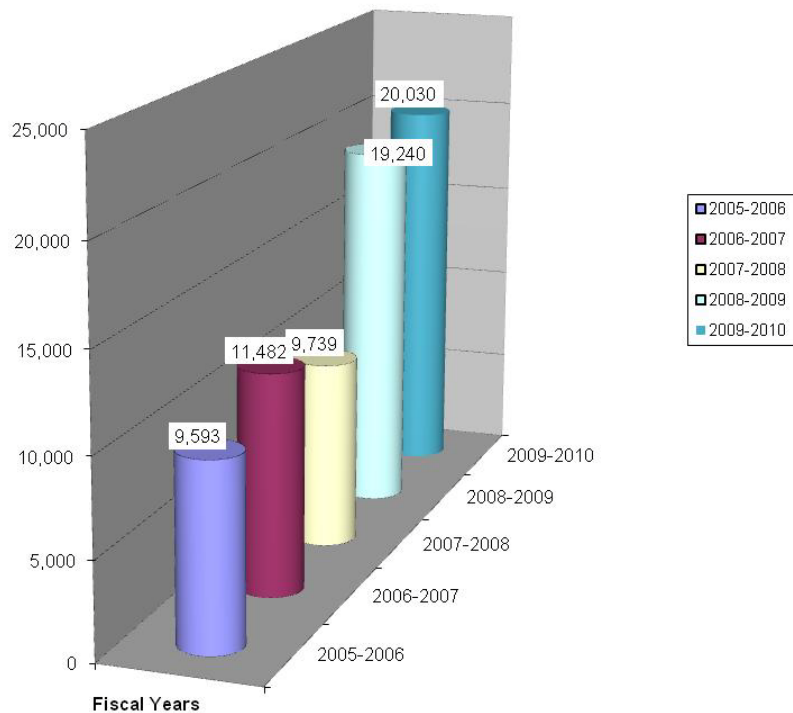

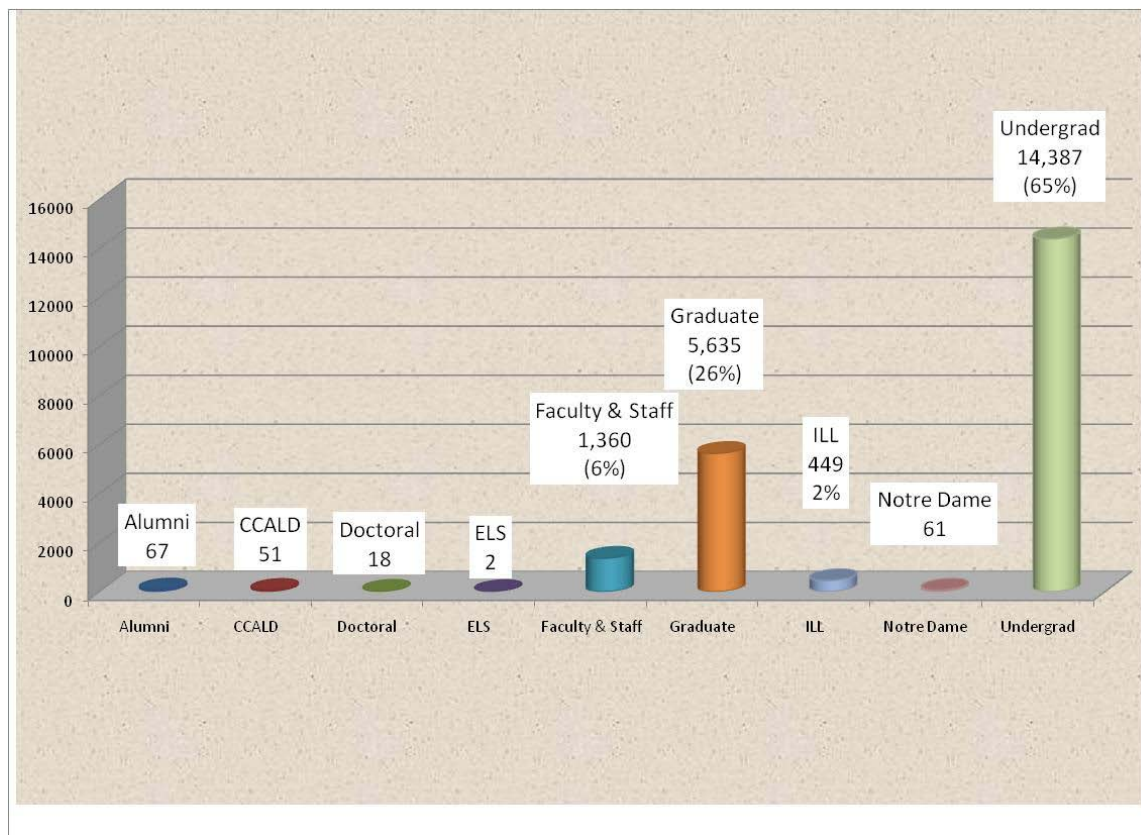
### Gate Count Monthly Comparison of Fiscal Years 2008/09 & 2009/10

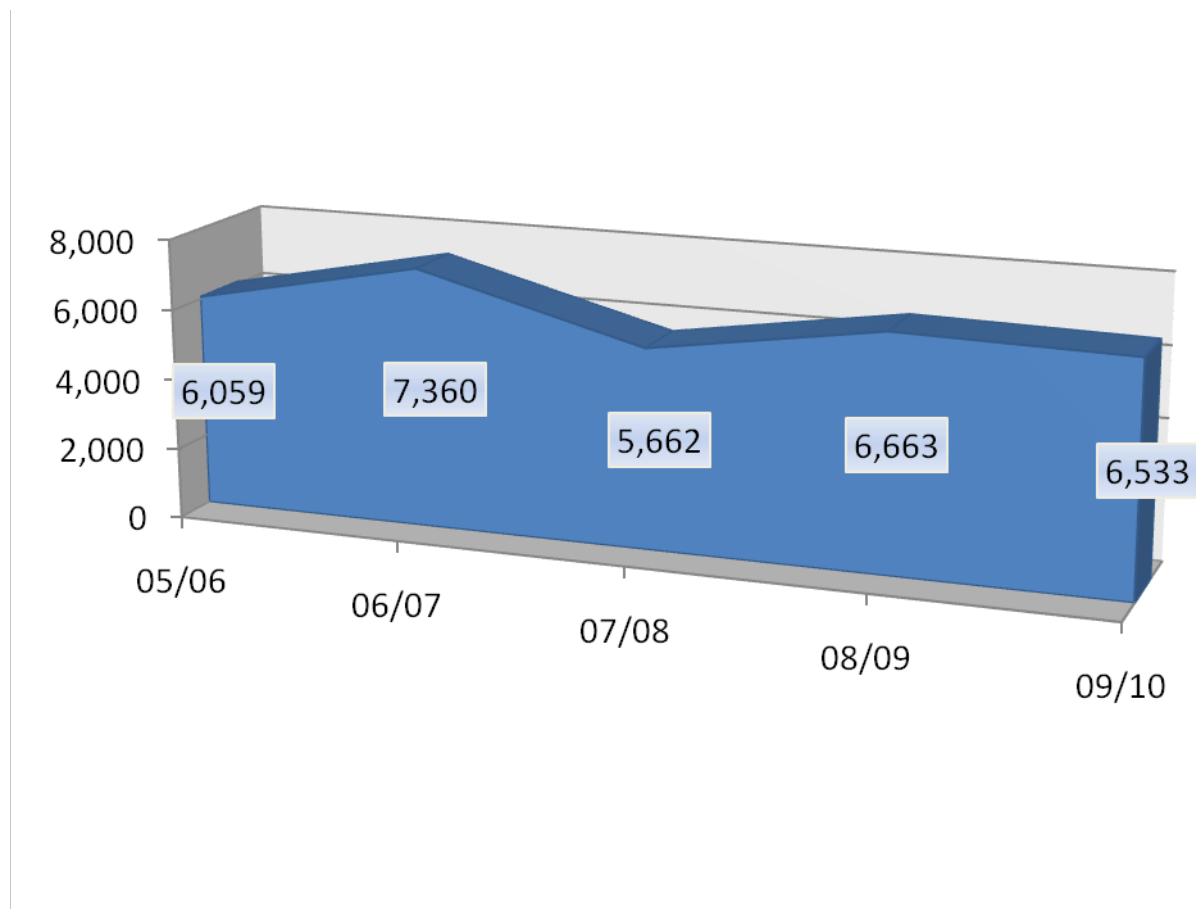
