OR...SMOOTHIES!"

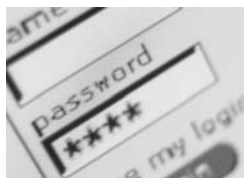

LOGGING ONTO LIBRARY COMPUTERS AND PRINTING



Students, faculty and staff log on to UNH computers with a username and password.

The Peterson Library has fifty-four Dell computers for our students, faculty and staff. You will need to log onto the computer with your UNH e-mail account username and password.

For the time being, printing is free of charge to currently enrolled students, faculty and staff of the University of New Haven. You will need to

swipe your UNH ID card to release printouts at the computer dedicated to the print management system.

The entire library is a UNH wireless zone. In addition, there are 130 network connection boxes on the walls and columns near individual carrels and desks that allow you to plug your laptops directly into the UNH network.

These are located on all three floors. All you need is an Ethernet card and network cable to connect to the campus network.

DATABASE NEWS

The library has recently purchased subscriptions to the following databases:

CQ Global Researcher (CQ Press)/CQ Global Researcher focuses on global affairs and aims to expose students to a variety of international viewpoints on a selected topic.

FORENSICnetBASE/LawENFORCEMENTnetBASE (CRC)/An essential resource for those studying forensic science techniques or

needing case studies.

Literary Reference Center (EBSCO)/A fully-searchable, comprehensive literature database that offers a vast amount of information from literary journals, books, literary encyclopedias and other pertinent reference works.

Mechanics and Mechanical Engineering Collection (Knovel)/Full text electronic manuals, handbooks and other reference

texts on the topics of mechanics and mechanical engineering.

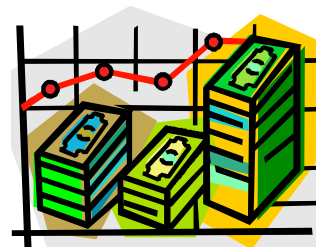

NEW ADAPTIVE TECHNOLOGY AVAILABLE IN THE LIBRARY

The library has received new equipment and adaptive software for UNH students and faculty who need assistance with the magnification of text and pictures. This equipment is housed in Room 200 on the library's main level. Anyone with a current, valid UNH ID can reserve the room and equipment ahead of time or on the spot, if the room is not already in use.

The computer has a larger screen monitor, large print keyboard, and ZoomText Magnifier/Screen Reader software (version 9.11). The Magnifier allows magnifica-

tion of all types and sizes of text in any application setting. The high resolution screens allow for magnification from 16x all the way to 36x. The Screen Reader echoes typing, reads information pointed to by the mouse, and speaks program events as they occur. Special headphones can be obtained at the Circulation Desk for use with this system exclusively and can be charged out with a UNH ID.

A CCTV system is also available to magnify the print in books and newspapers, as well as handwriting and photographs. The CCTV system

consists of a video camera that projects a magnified image of printed text, handwriting and photographs onto a video monitor PC or TV screen. In our case, we are using the PC monitor.

The same adaptive technology will be available in the Office of Disability Services. We are excited to be able to offer our students and faculty these new technologies in the library. The funding for this new technology was provided by a generous donor.
